Fr Alo writes . . .

The Advocate

John 14:15-21

I am in the middle of reading Fr Michael Fallon's book on John's Gospel. Reading the gospel passage for this weekend, I would like to quote what Fr Michael writes in his book:

"We have reached the climax of Jesus' farewell speech. Three times he insists on covenant love as being the essential response required of his disciples (14:15,21,23; compare 1John 2:3-4). Three times he assures them that they will not be left alone: the Spirit will be with them (14:16-17); he himself will be with them (14:18); and the Father will be with them (14:23). Each time he assures them that this intimate communion with the Spirit, with himself, and with the Father is something that only they as his disciples can experience. Jesus has just been speaking of the mission which he is entrusting to his disciples. He is going to carry on his mission through them. Clearly they cannot do this on their own and so he promises them the gift of 'another Advocate to be with you forever'. We are reminded of the encouraging words of the prophet Haggai:

'Take courage, O Zerubbabel, says the Lord; take courage, O Joshua, son of Jehozadak, the high priest; take courage, all you people of the land, says the Lord; work, for I am with you, says the Lord of hosts, according to the promise that I made you when you came out of Egypt. My spirit abides among you; do not fear. — Haggai 2:4-5' "

God is continuously caring for us. He promised to send us the advocate, His own Spirit. Be open to his presence in your midst. He never promised us an easy life, but he did promise a fulfilled life. Let the Spirit work in you.

RESUMPTION OF PUBLIC MASSES

The NSW Government has introduced Step 1 of the relaxation of restrictions on public gatherings as at Friday 15 May. Parish Masses of up to 10 people, not counting ministers and servers, will now be possible. Further details will be provided soon, but for the time being we will continue with the live streaming of Mass on Sunday.

UNDERSTANDING PARISH COLLECTIONS

There are generally two collections at weekend Masses. Funds collected are vital for the ongoing running of our Parish and for the support of our Parish Priest.

First Collection - Parish Priest

Money collected from the first collection goes towards paying for the living expenses of the Parish Priest, including the following:

- Month allowance
- Food & Drink
- Health Fund/Medical expenses
- Household items
- Housekeeper wage including Superannuation
- Cathedraticum a 10% contribution of the First Collection
- · A budgeted contribution to the MSC

Donations for baptisms, weddings and funerals as well as Easter and Christmas offerings are also banked to the First Collection.

Second Collection - Parish

Money collected from the second collection combines Planned Giving Envelope Collection and cash on the plate (30% of the Envelope Collection is tax deductible). These funds are used to cover the following expenses:

- Upkeep and ongoing maintenance of the Church, Rosary Room, Parish Office and Parish Hall
- Insurance (Parish Buildings, Public Liability, Volunteer Workers & Workers Comp)
- Parish staff wages including Superannuation
- Motor vehicle expenses
- Liturgical supplies
- Utilities, resources & running costs for the parish
- Pastoral programs such as scripture in state school
- CWF shortfalls

Donations for use of Church, Rosary Room and Hall as well as Hall Rental are also banked to the Second Collection.

CHILD PROTECTION WEEK 2020: CYBERSAFETY SURVEY

The Archdiocese of Sydney recognises that staying safe online is something many adults, children and young people are concerned about. Technology is changing now more than ever, it is important that we can remain aware of potential online challenges and equip ourselves with the tools we need to protect not only ourselves online but children and young people. In light of the current situation, more research has been conducted about the risks and challenges that children and young people face online, according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, ninety-seven per cent of households with children aged under 15 years have access to the internet, with an average number of seven devices per household, ninetynine per cent of young people aged 15 - 17 years are online averaging 18 hours per week of online activity.

The Safeguarding Office have developed a 5 minute CyberSafety Survey for adults and children to complete that will enable them to gain a better understanding about the knowledge adults, children and young people have about eSafety as well as developing resources that will target the needs of our Archdiocese community.

The CyberSafety Survey is made up of 26 questions, 13 of these questions are to be answered by adults and the other 11 questions are to be answered by children and young people. The survey is anonymous and will only take 5 minutes to complete, very quick and easy. We are encouraging as many people as possible to get involved, you don't have to have children in order to participate in the survey. The questions have been designed to be fun and gauge an individuals basic understanding of eSafety. The Safeguarding Office also ask what specific resources adults, children and young people would like developed to help them better understand eSafety.
